
**Vermont Housing Improvement Program** 

The Vermont Housing Improvement Program VHIP provides funding through Vermont's five Homeownership Centers to support private property owners to renovate and create new affordable housing units. These units serve Vermont's most vulnerable populations: people exiting homelessness, refugees, survivors of domestic abuse, and people exiting foster care and incarceration. The program has gone through multiple iterations since its creation in 2020-RHRP, and VHIP 1 and 2.0. VHIP remains committed to expanding Vermont's affordable housing stock for a minimal public investment.


