

# The Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

• The minimum amount of annual income that is needed for individuals and families to pay for essentials, such as room and board, clothes, and transportation. The FPL takes into account the number and ages of people in a household.



# Eligibility by Poverty Guidelines

- 138% = Maximum Eligibility for <u>Medicaid</u> and <u>CHIP</u> in states that expanded Medicaid
- 150% = Eligibility for United Way Rent and Utility Assistance, and Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) programs.
- 100% 400% = Eligibility for Premium tax credits on Health Insurance Marketplace plans
- 130% before deductions are applied = SNAP eligibility





### Vermonters in Poverty by Age Group over Time




#### 2019 Vermonters in Poverty by Race & Ethnicity





### Vermonters in Poverty by Thresholds over Time




