## Small Schools Adjustment and Sparsity Weights Compared with Current Law Small School Grant and Merger Support Grant Analysis

**Introduction**: Historically, the small school grant was intended to support the operational cost of small schools through categorical aid. The annual aid was determined by a formula, so the amount of funding for each school changed year to year. To be eligible for a small school support grant, the two-year average enrollment is less than 100, or if the average grade size is 20 or fewer. In addition, the merger support grant was a categorical aid program designed to be an incentive for small schools to merge. Each district that receives a merger support grant receives the same amount of aid each year through this program. In FY20 the appropriation for small schools grants was \$3.5 million dollars and \$4.9 million for the merger support grants.

In the 2020-2021 session, Act 73 was passed into law which states that, "a school district that received a small school grant in fiscal year 2020 shall continue to receive an annual small schools grant." Effectively, this changes the small school grant to act like the merger support grant because the amount of aid each year shall be the same as the amount from fiscal year 2020.

The "Pupil Weighting Factors Report" recommends replacing the small school grant with small school adjustment weights. The report states, "Stakeholders were uniformly frustrated with the State's Small Schools grant program, both in its design and operations. Stakeholders recommended abolishing the program, and instead, integrating weights in the equalized pupil calculation for geographically-necessary small schools." (page. 4) Geographically-necessary is defined by population density (people per square mile). The report also recommends using weight to adjust for sparsity using population density. The definitions for these weights are on page 2 of this analysis and are direct quotes from the report.

There is overlap in the design of the small school and merger support categorical aid and the small school adjustment weights. The categorical aid programs provide a constant value of financial support in perpetuity, whereas the weights adjust annually based on the student body characteristics. The table in this analysis indicates that 41 school districts would qualify for both the weight adjustment and the categorical aid; 49 would qualify for the weights adjustment; 51 currently qualify for the categorical aid.

Additional policy decisions regarding the small schools adjustment weights include the enrollment size and the population density threshold. The current law small schools grant eligibility is based on average daily membership (ADM) of 100 students or the average grade size is 20 students or fewer. Whereas, the weights eligibility is 250 students and requires "geographic necessity" as defined by population density of 55 persons per square mile. For example, a school with 120 students in a district with 30 people per square mile would qualify for the small schools adjustment weight, but a school with 120 students in a district with 100 people per square mile would not qualify.

## **Definitions from the "Pupil Weighting Factors Report"**

- **Population Density Adjustment.** The simulations apply a population density weight to a district's weighted long-term membership (Table 6.1, Step 3). Districts are eligible for this adjustment if they are in geographic areas with less than 100 persons per square mile. Our simulations adjust a district's long-term PK–12 membership using three gradients of population density by applying an additive weight: (1) <36 persons per square mile, (2) 36 to <55 persons, and (3) 55 to <100 persons.
- Small Schools Adjustment. A district's weighted long-term membership is also adjusted for the additional cost of operating small schools in geographically isolated areas of the State (Table 6.1, Step 3). The simulations apply a school size weight to the long-term membership of a school when a district is in a sparsely populated geographic area (i.e., schools with an ADM of less than 250 students and in a district with less than 55 persons per square mile). Appendix B lists the schools that qualified for this adjustment, based on FY2018 enrollment.

This table shows the FY20 school districts eligibility for the Small School Adjustment and Population Density from the "Pupil Weighting Factors Report", the eligibility for a small school or merger support grant from current law, and the overlap of the small school adjustment weight and the small school or merger support grants. Additional information on school that qualify for the Small School Adjustment can be found in Appendix B of the Report.
