8. Purpose of Grant:

The funding will supplement the FY2016 \$505,000 grant budget for the Working Lands Enterprise Program. These monies will help fund grants to businesses and technical assistance providers. Business grants may be for up to \$50,000, and must display innovation, test a new business model, or address a specific supply chain need. Service Provider grants may be for up to \$75,000 and must demonstrate direct impacts on working lands businesses, including increased sales, job creation or increased output.

The authorizing statute for the Working Lands Enterprise Program states that: "the fund shall be composed of moneys from time to time appropriated to the fund by the general assembly or received from any other source, private or public, approved by the board, and unexpended balances and any earnings shall remain in the fund from year to year."

All funding decisions are made by the WLEB (Working Lands Enterprise Board), which is composed of 20 public, private and non-profit members and chaired by Deputy Secretary LaClair (acting designee for Secretary Ross). Donors will have no input into the decision making process.

9. Impact on existing program if grant is not Accepted:

The FY2016 grant cycle is highly competitive; we have received 114 applications totaling \$3.3 million in requests. The additional funds would allow us to support a greater number of eligible and worthy applicants, in turn creating jobs, increasing sales, and increasing or maintaining working lands acreage in production.

Re: Request to Expedite AA-1 Process – Working Lands Enterprise Fund Donations

The following entities have pledged donations to the Agency of Agriculture, Food, and Markets to supplement the FY2016 \$505,000 grant budget for the Working Lands Enterprise Initiative. These monies will help fund grants to businesses and technical assistance providers.

• \$100,000 Merinoff Family of Meadows Bee Farm, Windham, Vermont

• \$ 50,000 The Progressive Farm Alliance, Shoreham, Vermont

• \$ 25,000 Long Trail Brewing Company, Bridgewater Corners, Vermont

Business grants may be for up to \$50,000, and must display innovation, test a new business model, or address a specific supply chain need.

Service Provider grants may be for up to \$75,000 and must demonstrate direct impacts on working lands businesses, including increased sales, job creation or increased output.

In the FY2016 grant cycle we have received 114 applications for \$3.3 million in funds. All funding decisions are made by the WLEB (Working Lands Enterprise Board), which is composed of 20 public, private and non-profit members and chaired by Deputy Secretary LaClair (acting designee for Secretary Ross). Donors will have no input into the decision making process.

We are requesting an expedited review, as the WLEB meets on March 15 to decide on Business grants, and the number of grants approved will depend on the amount of funds available.

Enclosed are the pledges from the three entities outlining the stipulations of their donation and expectations to support the Working Lands Enterprise Initiative.
