Enclosed please find four (4) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration.

JFO #2616 – \$781,226 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Vermont Department of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used to develop a water quality trading initiative intended to reduce nonpoint source phosphorus pollution loading in Lake Champlain (from the Missisquoi Bay and Otter Creek).

JFO #2617 – \$75,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the Vermont Department of Agriculture, Food and Markets. These funds will be used to support the State's efforts to develop an agricultural water quality improvement program through outreach to farmers and nonagricultural stakeholders and the creation of a database designed to track water quality progress.

JFO #2618 – \$10,000 grant from the National Alcohol Beverage Control Association to the Vermont Department of Liquor Control. These funds will be used to produce and distribute materials to help employers detect fraudulent identifications.

[JFO received 03/27/13]

JFO #2619 – \$219,898 grant from the Northern Border Regional Commission to the Vermont Telecommunications Authority (VTA). These funds will be used to assist the VTA in completing construction of a 13-mile segment of a 178-mile fiber-optic network in the northeastern Vermont. [JFO received 03/27/13]

Vermont Department of Liquor Control 2013 Educational Award

Project Description

Summary:

The Vermont Department of Liquor Control has elected to create kits to help businesses and their employees detect fraudulent IDs.

We will be including information ID checking guides which we will purchase in bulk to provide a lesser cost to our consumers. They will also include a magnifying device, black light, an envelope designed to let the businesses get the ID's to the authorities as well as a guide to how to use the

We will be working with businesses to promote the new kits. They will be available to purchase for businesses and individuals who work in the industry to help.

Criteria:

- The guidebook will assist Vermont youth in making well informed decisions not to use alcohol or other prohibited substances.
- 2. This project will be under the direct supervision of the Vermont Department of Liquor Control.
- 3. DLC Education Investigator Steven M. Waldo will be the project coordinator. He is also the Vermont representative to the NABCA Education Task Force.

Time Line:

While the grant is being processed, our Education Division will be modifying the content to our Vermont youth needs, while in consultation with our prevention and health experts. The final product will be quickly sent to various vetted printers for price quotes and a suitable printer will be chosen. We will be looking to our community coalitions to assist us in the distribution of the guidebooks throughout the State and anticipate they will be in the hands of our young people by Spring Break time.

Evaluation:

Armed with timely, truthful information, our Vermont youth will be able to correctly choose a healthy path to becoming productive and happy adults by not using alcohol as so many of their classmates seem to do.

Sustainability:

We will be converting the document into a PDF format so it might be placed on our department website for printing by any and all.
