Enclosed please find eight (8) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration. One limited service position is associated with these items.

JFO #2643 – \$150,000 grant from New England Waste Services of Vermont to the Vermont Agency of Transportation. These funds will be used to match federal funding designated for improvements to the Newport State Airport.

JFO #2644 – Donation of truck and trailer valued at \$17,870 from Fletcher Allen Health Care to the Vermont Department of Health. This equipment will become part of the Public Health Preparedness program (in support of the Medical Reserve Corp, Medical Surge, and Mobile Hospital) and be deployed when requested by Vermont hospitals and local emergency response agencies.

JFO #2645 – \$60,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Vermont Department of Corrections. These funds will be used to create a system-wide approach to reentry by assembling a task force of stakeholders to analyze current conditions and develop a plan that includes recidivism reduction goals.

JFO #2646 – \$300,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Vermont Judiciary. These funds will be used in Windham County to implement a domestic violence docket that will enhance services to victims of domestic violence. One (1) limited service position is associated with this request. [JFO received 10/28/13]

JFO #2647 – \$325,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to the Vermont Department of Health. These funds will be used to enhance health policies focused on Vermont youth, such as measuring the health environment at schools and conducting the Youth Risk Behavior Survey. [JFO received 10/28/13]

JFO #2648 - \$450,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to the Vermont Agency of Human Services. This grant will fund an employment program aimed at helping older

refugees find employment. The funding will also support younger refugees making the transition from secondary school to the workforce or higher education.

JFO #2649 – \$64,902 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Vermont Center for Crime Victim Services (VCCVS). These funds will be used to develop a plan for increasing accessibility to VCCVS services among people with disabilities.

JFO #2650 – \$264,104 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice to the Vermont Center for Crime Victim Services (VCCVS). These funds will be used support a training program (for law enforcement and advocates) designed to promote cooperation and produce a plan aimed at reducing fatalities associated with domestic violence and stalking.

Proposal Abstract

Enforcement of Protection Orders Program in order to diminish the number of domestic violence, sexual violence and stalking related fatalities in the state of Vermont and increase leadership capacity around crimes of violence against women. This will be achieved through the implementation of a leadership training program for law enforcement, the development of a leadership training program for violence against women advocates, and from these trainings bringing together law enforcement and advocate leaders to form a task force that will develop a statewide strategic plan for the reduction of domestic violence, sexual violence and stalking related fatalities. Victims of domestic violence, sexual violence and stalking in the state of Vermont will benefit from the increased leadership by law enforcement and advocates in responding to incidents of violence. In addition, a coordinated response between law enforcement, victim advocates, and other key stakeholders in Vermont will further address gaps in lethality assessments and develop strategies to reduce the number of fatalities caused as a result of violence against women.

The goal of the proposed project is to increase the leadership capacity of law enforcement and violence against women advocates in an effort to develop collaborative leadership strategies to reduce fatalities caused as a result of domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking. This goal will be met by completion of four objectives: 1) Provide leadership training to members of law enforcement across the state of Vermont; 2) Develop and implement a leadership training for advocates working in the violence against women field; 3) Develop and implement a series of engagement activities and combined training for newly trained law enforcement and advocate leaders to strengthen relationships and promote collaborative leadership initiatives.; and 4) Convene a task force of experts to develop a statewide Strategic Plan for Fatality Reduction.

The development and implementation of the Vermont law enforcement leadership institute will

be conducted by consultant Thomas Tremblay and the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). Mr. Tremblay will also consult on the development of the advocacy leadership curriculum, will coordinate engagement activities following the law enforcement training, and will assist with the implementation of the statewide strategic planning task force. The Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence will be involved in the coordination of the implementation and development of the Vermont advocate leadership institute, coordination of engagement activities, development of joint training, and implementation of the statewide strategic planning task force. Circle, a domestic violence agency in Vermont will serve as the victim service organization partner and will be involved in the development and implementation of the advocate leadership institute and will participate in the implementation of the statewide strategic planning task force. The task force will be made up of leaders across the state, including representatives from the Domestic Violence Fatality Review Commission, Office of the Attorney General, Council on Domestic Violence, Vermont Center for Crime Victim Services, Vermont Network, and representatives from the domestic and sexual violence agency programs, local and state law enforcement, and sheriff departments, who have attended the leadership trainings.

The Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence will serve as a consultant on this project and will be involved in the coordination of grant activities, including the development and

implementation of the advocacy leadership institute, joint training and engagement for advocates, and the strategic planning task force. Personnel funding will be provided for the Executive Director, Legal Projects Coordinator, Associate Director of Member Program Support, Children's Advocate, and Training and Technical Assistance Coordinator. The Executive Director will devote 10% of her time to this project over the three year grant period. She will participate in quarterly grant meetings, coordinate the development and implementation of the advocacy leadership curriculum, assist with the development and implementation of the strategic planning task force and participate in task force meetings. The Legal Projects Coordinator will be involved in the development and implementation of the advocacy leadership training curriculum in year 1 and will coordinate the engagement and joint training activities for 10 hours per week during years 2 and 3 of the grant. The Associate Director of Member Program Support, Children's Advocate, and Training and Technical Assistance Coordinator will be involved with the development of the advocacy leadership curriculum during year 1 and will assist with the implementation of the training in year 2.

The Vermont Network will also conduct the 5-day training program and will coordinate participant travel and logistics in attending the training. Compensation includes funding for consultation, travel (local travel, lodging and per diem for faculty/staff), and other training costs. Travel costs for participants will include local travel reimbursement (mileage), lodging, and daily per diem. Event costs include facility rental and event supplies, such as resources, printing and postage.
