Personnel Fringe Benefits	 Jared Ulmer, Vermont Department of Health - Project Manager @ \$95,311 X 10% of time on project = \$28,593 for 3 years Amy Redman, Vermont Department of Health - Health Equity Lead @ \$71,637 X 20% of time on project = \$42,982 for 3 years Personnel costs have been set at these levels for two reasons: First, to embody a community-led approach, much of this award will flow out to community partners and allow them, in consultation with us, to lead the implementation of this project. We will provide administrative support, technical assistance, and other guidance, but are intentionally trying to play more of a support and learning role. Secondly, the proposed project activities overlap with existing job duties and funding sources for these staff, allowing additional staff time to be paid for "in-kind" by other funding sources. Specifically, beginning in May 2024, Amy Redman's position will be funded in part by a Federal Infrastructure Grant, with job duties that include supporting environmental justice activities and building community partnerships. Jared Ulmer's position is funded primarily by a CDC Climate & Health grant, with a current work plan that includes activities for supporting home energy efficiency and healthy housing. 51.9% of Salary (\$71,575 X 51.9%) Fringe costs include FICA; retirement plan contribution; medical, dental, and life insurance. The actual cost of fringe benefits varies from employee to employee based on salary, employee choice of health care plan, and employee election of certain other benefits. The usual, major components of this cost are FICA at approximately 7% of salary. The cost of each employee's fringe benefits will be allocated to the project based on hours worked on the program relative to all hours worked by the employee. Based on the current, average cost of fringe benefits for employees assigned to this project, we are estimating the cost of fringe benefits at 51.9% of salary. 	\$71,575 \$37,147
