Enclosed please find two (2) items that the Joint Fiscal Office has received from the administration, including the establishment of two (2) limited service positions.

JFO #2628 – \$878,205 donation (\$690,755 cash, \$173,100) from the estate of Mamie Thurston to the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife. These funds will be used to offset declining revenues to the Nongame Fund, and thereby support initiatives focused on endangered and threatened species. [JFO received 06/19/13]

JFO #2629 – Request to establish two (2) limited service positions in the Department of Health. These positions will manage the Childhood Passenger Safety program. The program is funded via a grant to the Department of Public Safety, which has entered into an MOU with the Health Department to manage the program.

Attached is the Department's Request for Grant Acceptance (Form AA-1) for assets from the Mamie H. Thurston Property valued at \$878,205. The executor of the estate has identified these assets and requested that they and the resulting income should be received by the Department's Nongame Fund. This fund is dedicated to the protection of Vermont's rare, threatened, and endangered species, natural communities, and the conservation of Vermont's wildlife heritage. The fund's focus is on wildlife species that are neither fished nor hunted as well as Vermont's native plants. As such, the Nongame Fund provides support for the Department's Wildlife Diversity Program responsible for monitoring and protecting species such as bats, turtles, amphibians, and invertebrates and their habitats. In addition, the program improves nesting sites for nongame birds, assists with local planning efforts, maps important habitats and natural communities, and engages in other supporting initiatives. Many of these species and activities are ineligible for the standard Federal Pittman-Robinson monies, which are limited to the conservation of birds and mammals.

The Department has historically relied almost solely upon Federal State Wildlife Grant (SWG) funds, Section 6 monies, and the Nongame Fund (conservation license plate sales and donations) to support the Wildlife Diversity Program. This grant to the Nongame Fund will provide sustainable funding for mission critical programs at a time when other funding sources for rare, threatened and endangered species have declined significantly. During the past three years the Department's Federal SWG funding has been reduced from a high of \$764,000 in FY10 to \$471,000 in FY13 (a 39% decline in 3 years). In addition, Section 6 monies have declined, while contributions to the Nongame Fund also decreased from \$205,000 in FY10 to an estimated \$150,000 in FY13 (a 27% decline). Meeting the Department's mission in the face of these funding declines is further challenged by increased threats related to climate change, habitat alteration/destruction, and disease. Without these additional funds, important initiatives aimed to meet these needs would have to be curtailed or eliminated.



During the next two to three years, this grant will allow the Department to offset at least a portion of the reduced funding and maintain the current capacity of the existing projects in the following ways:

- Fully fund ongoing SWG jobs that otherwise might have to be terminated
- Focus attention on reptile, amphibian, and invertebrate populations, some of which have disease concerns
- Update the Wildlife Action Plan for Species of Greatest Conservation Need as required by the Federal US Fish and Wildlife Service in order to maintain eligibility for future SWG funds
- Develop climate change resiliency priorities
- Map rare and irreplaceable natural communities and critical habitats.

8. Purpose of Grant:

The Department of Fish & Wildlife Nongame Fund has been identified as a recipient of \$878,205 from the Mamie H. Thurston estate. These funds will be used to help offset the continuing decline of federal funds and the State's conservation plate program. This donation will allow the Department to continue funding nongame initatives that are focused on endangered and threatened species including bats, turtles, birds, fish, lynx, marten, and invertebrates. These funds can be used to match existing federal dollars thus potentially increasing capacity.

9. Impact on existing program if grant is not Accepted:

The Department's nongame funding options have decreased steadily over the past couple of years. The available federal funding has been reduced from a high of \$764,000 in FY10 to \$471,000 in FY13. In addition, Section 6 funds that are normally applied to the conservation of federally endangerd species in Vermont were also significantly cut this year. Conservation license plate sales and donations to the nongame fund have likewise decreased in the last three years. If this grant is not accepted the Department will have to eliminate and/or reduce the capacity of numerous non-game iniatives including, but not limited to:

- The adequate conclusion of ongoing SWG jobs,
- The focus on reptile, amphibian, and invertebrate populations some of which have disease concerns
- Updating the Wildlife Action Plan for Species of Greatest Conservation Need as required by the Federal US Fish and Wildlife Service in order to maintain eligibility for future SWG funds
- Developing climate change resiliency priorities
- Mapping rare and irreplaceable natural communities and critical habitats.
