Videoconferencing Grant for Vermont Public Libraries

The Vermont Department of Libraries is working with Google on a grant to place videoconference equipment and services in seven Vermont public libraries and the Midstate Library Service Center. Amy Howlett is the project coordinator. Each public library will be added to the Learning Network of Vermont (LNV), a network which connects Vermont's high schools and provides basic videoconferencing and training. A vendor will supply the equipment, initial training and installation and troubleshooting for the first year.

The LNV will provide the meeting/conference scheduling system so that each library site can schedule and run video conferences at will. The LNV houses the MCU bridge which manages the conference signals. In addition, libraries may connect to outside sites on the Internet via web-based software (currently Scopia Desktop Video Conferencing). The library videoconferencing sites will also be able to invite individuals to connect to videoconferences using the web-based software.

The Videoconferencing Grant provides:

- Videoconference equipment (codec, monitor, microphones/ camera)
- Equipment installation
- Training for 2 library employees
- Equipment warranties for three years
- Access to the LNV
- Local wiring assistance for the Internet connection

The value of the equipment, training and support services for each site is well above \$8000. Grant personnel will coordinate statewide publicity to announce videoconferencing services in the selected Vermont libraries. The Vermont Department of Libraries will offer participating libraries some fee-based content, from providers like NASA, Smithsonian Museums, Baseball Hall of Fame, Library of Congress, Mote Marine Laboratory, Manhattan School of Music, and the Cincinnati Art Museum.

Uses of videoconferencing by Vermont public libraries may include:

- Town or library employees attending/holding virtual meetings
- Town or library employees using web software to join face to face videoconferences
- Local farmers consulting with UVM or out-of-state experts
- An out-of-state author "visit" for a local audience, broadcast on a big screen
- The local library hosting meetings/trainings with other libraries around the state
- Library staff interacting with the state librarian and staff in other libraries
- Local citizens interacting with state officials, face to face
- Area CPAs attending IRS training
- Individuals interviewing with potential employers out of state
- Local business people taking or conducting seminars
- Library audiences connecting with cultural centers like the Smithsonian or NASA

The Department of Libraries has selected the seven libraries, including yours, based on the criteria below.

- interest and willingness of local library;
- library broadband/bandwidth capacity;
- ability to assign library staff the time for training and implementation of the project;
- potential for sustainability of videoconferencing at site;
- level of engagement with local community;
- library space for videoconferencing programming and private use by citizens/organizations.
