Campbell, 91, died May 27, 2005, in Burlington.

She was born in Springhill, Nova Scotia, Canada, April 26, 1914, sixth of the seven children of Robert Wellington and Annie (Snow) Newcombe.

Orphaned at the age of 16, she immigrated to Boston to join her older sisters and was fortunate to land her first job, at the height of the Depression, as a coffee shop cashier.

There she met and eventually married Robert Campbell, an aspiring art dealer. Together they raised four children, Robert Roy, Joode Ann, Linda Newcombe and Susan Juanita in the sprawling Newton, Mass., house they shared with her beloved sister, Nina.

The couple eventually moved into Boston, living above Bob's Shore Studios art gallery on Newbury Street, and also enjoyed a summer house in Provincetown, home to a second Shore Gallery. Grace made her living room an informal extension of both galleries, and made lifelong friends of many Boston and Provincetown established and aspiring artists.

Grace was a natural storyteller, a wonderful cook, a prolific knitter, an effortless hostess. Her tales of Canadian country life were an endless fascination for her children and grandchildren, as eagerly anticipated at family gatherings as were the fruits of her kitchen. Her roast beef dinners were legendary, as were her desserts, especially chocolate cakes and lemon meringue and apple pies. Her talents in knitting and generous nature led to a cottage industry in unique, outrageously colorful winter hats which she created for friends and family. Years later, her distinctive hats are still treasured, and strangers in Boston and Burlington have been known to become acquainted when they recognize each other as the wearer of one of Grace's hats.

Widowed, Grace made her home with her sister Nina in St. Petersburg, Fla., and Onset, Mass., before they moved to Burlington, in 2002.

Grace leaves four children; seven grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and many friends and relatives in the United States, Canada and Great Britain, who loved her and cherish happy memories of gathering in the warm and welcoming home she created.

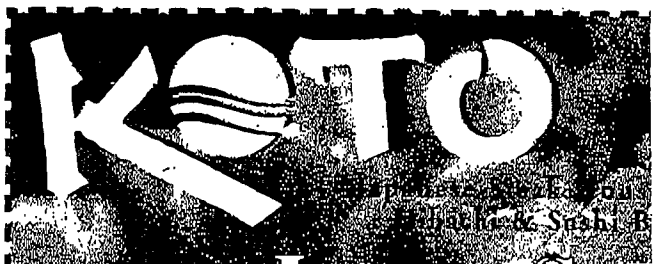
She was born in Underhill, N.H., daughter of Joseph and Marie (Companion) Bouffard.

Rita worked at Champlain, Porter Science University of Vermont, Blodgett's, Montgomery and Merrill Transport. She retired in 1981, with her husband.

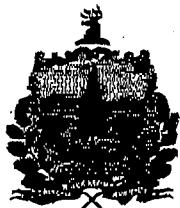
Rita was married to Vartulli Sr. on Sept. 2, 1938. He predeceased her in 1983.
