Grace made her living room an informal extension - of both galleries, and made lifelong friends of many Boston and Provincetown established and

aspiring artists. Grace was a natural storyteller, a wonderful cook a prolific knitter, an effortless hostess. Her tales of Canadian country life were an eridless fascination for her children and grandchildren, as eagerly anticipated at family gatherings as were the fruits of her kitchen. Her roast beef dinners were legendary, as were her desserts, especially chocolate, cakes and lemon meringue and apple pies. Her talents in knitting and generous nature led to a cottage industry in unique, outrageously colorful winter hats which she created for friends and family. 

Department of Libraries (Special Services Unit), their heirs, administrators, successors and assigns, forever.

And said Joseph D. Fallon is ordered to pay over and deliver said estate according to this Decree.
